We have gone from Happy New Year to Happy Valentines Day. Can you believe how fast January flew by? December and the beginning of January proved to be very mild, and I have to admit, I kind of enjoyed it. I'm not used to wearing shorts on Christmas Day. For those of you that don't know this tidbit, my brother Russell Bliese & his wife Linda also live in Walden. The four of us flew to California on December the 26th to celebrate my uncle's 100th birthday. The last time that I saw him was when he came to Walden to help celebrate my dad's 86th birthday knowing that it would be his last. My parents Ronnie & Joan Bliese were also residents of Walden up until their deaths in 2017 & 2019. As we say, keep your family close and dear. I have included a group picture. What a milestone.



Since I mentioned that Valentines Day is coming up, remember that if you have roses, February 14th is the day to trim them back. When I say trim them, I don't mean just a little. You can cut them back 1/3 to 1/2 and they will be just fine. I've always said, the more you trim, the more it grows.

You have all had a few months off not really doing any gardening. Mine has just been moving various plants around to other flower beds and spraying for the deer. This month you actually have a few things that you need to do.

First of all, with the warm weather that we have been experiencing, weeds are going to start germinating.

This means that you will need to apply Pre-Emergent Herbicide. If you also want an early green-up of your lawn, you can apply Nitro-Phos Imperial 15-5-10 or Weed & Feed 15-5-10 also by Nitro-Phos. Of course, these items can be purchased at C & S Feed Store in Montgomery. You will find a feeding program included to help you know when to do your fertilization etc.

I have a very large Bradford pear in my side yard. While we were in California, we had a cold snap and when we returned home, the neighborhood kids walking down the easement were playing in the leaves that had fallen. I told them they could continue playing if they took some of the lemons that I had picked from my tree. Last month I told you that I has about 400 lemons. Well, I'm here to tell you that the final count was 582 lemons. I gave away so many lemons, I even took bags to the elementary school for the teachers to enjoy and the pastry chef at Carriage Inn in Huntsville got about 150 to make her delicious lemon tarts etc. BTW, I'm still waiting for my Bradford pear to shed the rest of its leaves. We need a longer cold snap and I hope that by the time you are reading this, it has happened.

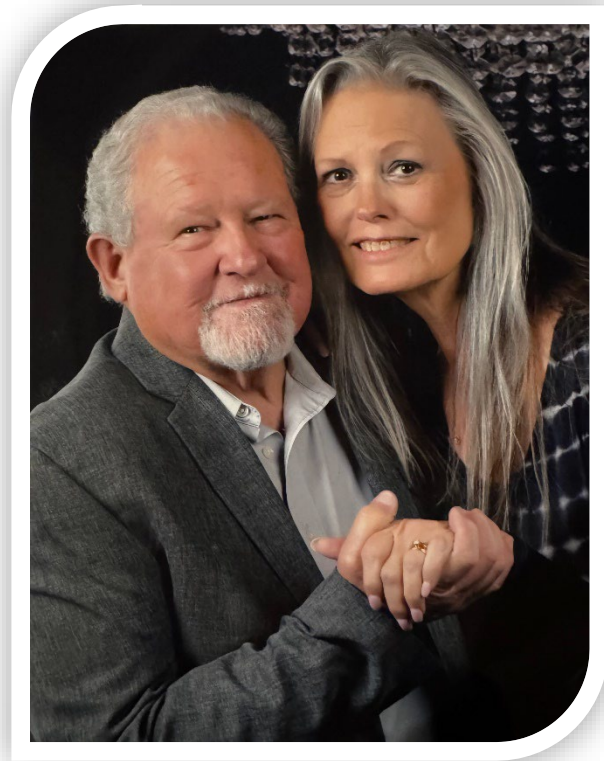

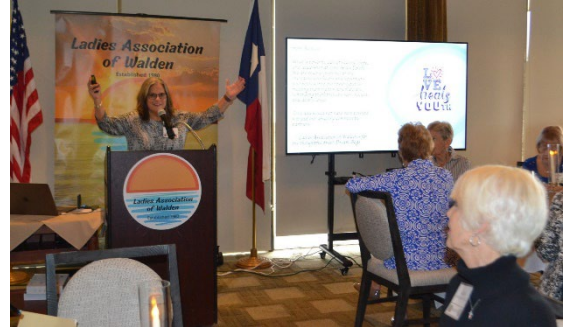

After another great breakfast, the Walden Men's Breakfast meeting held January 9th featured Mr. Aubrey Spear, General Manager of the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA). Mr. Spear provided a quick overview of the SJRA 5 Divisions and then he talked about two topics.

1. Encroachment Agreements: SJRA owns a strip of land around Lake Conroe (yes, if you live on lake front property you do not own some the land adjacent to the lake). He explained how to check your property survey to determine if an Encroachment Agreement is needed.
2. Lake Conroe Operations: He reviewed operations of Lake Conroe; the recent permit change to increase the maximum discharge rate from 700 cfs to 2000 cfs; and future public meetings being scheduled to support the development protocols to be used on releasing water from Lake Conroe.

The presentation was very informative.
